Footnotes

CARRESSA three deep then off the rail on the first turn, angled to the inside on the backstretch, split horses on the second turn, bid three wide into the stretch to gain the lead and won clear under a moderate hand ride and a hold late. PINK SCATILLAC had a shoe fixed in the paddock, came off the rail into the first turn and dueled outside a rival then three deep leaving the backstretch and into the second turn, continued outside a foe while a bit hemmed in by the riderless horse passing the quarter pole, was not a match for the winner in the stretch but clearly second best. FULL ECLIPSE chased off the rail then went up three deep on the backstretch and into the second turn, came three wide into the stretch and bested the others. CRYSTAL LAKE a bit slow to begin, pulled just off the rail and was in tight into the first turn, bid inside to duel for the lead, was in a bit tight nearing midway on the second turn and dropped back, came out into the stretch and had little left for the drive. TRUE MISCHIEF had speed three deep then angled in and tugged between horses with a bid on the backstretch, dueled between foes then inside leaving the second turn and gave way in the stretch. UNICORN stumbled badly at the start and lost the rider, ran around with the field then was vanned off after being unsaddled on the clubhouse turn. The stewards conducted an inquiry into the start before ruling UNICORN was the cause of her own trouble.
