STRIKE APPEAL went to the front, rounded the first turn in the two path, lost the lead entering the backstretch, disputed the pace on the outside, vied in the three path on the far turn, took the advantage outside the quarter-pole, responded well when put to a drive in upper stretch, shook off two foes into the final furlong and drew away under strong urging. MR. BIG NEWS broke a step slow, went around the first turn in the two path, settled off the pace, was roused in the two path late on the far turn, advanced to make a bid in upper stretch, lost touch with the winner inside the furlong marker and proved no match while clear for the place. CERNAN went four then three wide on the first turn, settled off the pace, went three then four wide early on the far turn, was roused around the five-sixteenths, shifted five wide outside the quarter-pole, advanced under a drive to make an outside bid in upper stretch, dropped back into the final furlong and came up empty while best of the rest. CAVALRY CHARGE bobbled at the start but recovered quickly, raced inside on the first turn, moved up to take the lead entering the backstretch, disputed the pace on the inside of the winner, vied along the rail on the far turn, was asked outside the five-sixteenths, lost the advantage outside the quarter-pole, dropped back into upper stretch and gave way. EL SUPREMO went around the first turn in the three path, tracked the pace on the outside, made a bid in the four path on the far turn, was roused approaching the five-sixteenths, dropped back under a drive in upper stretch and faltered.
