Although 1 **CALL ME PLUCKY** was bumped at the start and lost early position, he received a good closers trip in his turf debut. The pace was fast and Sheldon Russell was able to save ground by splitting horses on the final turn before easing out with a look turning for home. The son of stakes-placed turfer Misty in Malibu was firing late and was flattered when the runner-up returned to graduate at Colonial Downs. Doesn't have much early speed, but don't think he needs to be 20 lengths out of it down the backstretch given a moderate pace scenario. 7 **LASTING IMAGE** seems like an interesting horse with dirtied-up form. Showed some late life in first start off the break despite catching a race without much pace, then found a decent field at Delaware last time out (finished ahead of next-out 77-Beyer winner Palace Kitten). Can get the jump on the top pick turning into the lane. 2 **DESHACKLED**'s best two races have come on turf and he is eligible to show good speed stretching out on the grass for the first time. Dam won at this distance. INFINITY a half to four-time stakes-winner My Magician and stakes-placed Miss Philly Dilly (both did best on dirt). SUPER HOUDINI a half to multiple stakes-placed dirt performer Flash McCaul.
