FIRST CAPTAIN brushed with a rival at the start while asked, stalked the pace on the outside then in the two to three path on the turn, had the rider take a confident peak behind him at the five-sixteenths, was asked outside the quarter-pole then led under into the stretch under increasing urging, lost the advantage to HOMETOWN at the three-sixteenths, was forced in by that foe at the furlong marker, came back to get the lead inside the sixteenth-pole then was put to a left-handed crop to keep his mind on business while edging out to brush his combatant and prevailed in the end. HOMETOWN came away in good order, tugged at the bit while rated under a long hold just off the pace, remained under restraint in the two path early on the turn, angled four wide while let out at the five-sixteenths, rallied on the outside coming to the quarter-pole then swept to the lead into upper stretch, drifted in under a right-handed crop at the furlong marker and forced in the winner then was straightened by the rider, came in a bit again when put back to one more pop of a right-handed crop outside the sixteenth-pole, swapped back to his inside lead shortly thereafter, led into the final sixteenth then relinquished the advantage back to the winner and missed while well clear for the place. DUST DEVIL was taken under a snug hold early then rated off the pace while into the bit, went three to four wide early on the turn, was let out before the five-sixteenths then moved to five wide, chased outside under the crop into the stretch and weakened but was well clear for the show. THE BIG KAHUNA was a bit reluctant to load, came away very fast, showed the way down the backstretch, was coaxed along while inside to the two path on the turn, came under stronger encouragement before the five-sixteenths, was headed into the stretch and tired. SUPPLY AND DEMAND was off slow and spotted the front a few lengths, settled at the rear under coaxing, dropped from the three path to close to the rail on the turn and failed to respond.
