**2** **BUFF HELLO** (\$26,000 yearling) appeared to run in spots in circuit debut and might focus better with the addition of blinkers. Broke sharp and was hustled up to prompt the pace from the outside, then appeared intimidated when placed in tight in between rivals on the bend. Split foes once straightened out and came with a solid run to just miss. Full brother to multiple juvenile stakes-placed dirt sprinter Latin Spice has the valuable experience edge. **6** **CANDY COOL** (\$250,000 weanling; \$575,000 yearling) is a half-sister to Blue Chipper, a champion sprinter in Korea that finished third in the Breeders' Cup Mile in 2019. Dam won the Grade 2 Demoiselle around two turns at two. Second dam was a Grade 2-placed dirt sprinter. Solid breezes at Fair Hill. **3** **HEAVENLY TRIP** (\$2,000 yearling), a son of stakes-winning dirt router Orbiston Parva, showed good speed to finish ahead of Slaats (returned to finish a neck behind Buff Hello when third in a maiden special with a 62 Beyer). Should be prominent from the start. **LOCKDOWN LARRY** is a half-brother to stakes-winning dirt router Shackled Love. Dam was a stakes-winning dirt miler. **HUSBAND MATERIAL** (\$195,000 March juvenile RNA) breezed a furlong in 10 3/5 seconds prior to the auction and is a half-brother to stakes-winning dirt router Uncle Lino. Dam is a full sister to Grade 1 Alabama winner Lady Joanne and a half-sister to Preakness winner Shackleford.
